

LSAT Checklist

Weeks before the test

Read the LSAT Candidate Information Sheet and read the Test Center Rules at LSAC.org.
In order to be admitted to the LSAT, you must present two forms of identification.

A government-issued ID

Your photo-bearing LSAT Admission Ticket (the photo you uploaded through LSAC.org)

Check your ID.

Is it an acceptable government-issued ID as stipulated at LSAC.org and on the LSAT Candidate Information Sheet? Remember, student IDs are **not** acceptable.

Is it current (or has it expired within 90 days of your test)?

Does it contain a recent, recognizable photo?

Does it contain your date of birth?

Do the first and last names on your ID match exactly the first and last names printed on your LSAT Admission Ticket? Corrections must be submitted to LSAC as soon as possible to ensure the change can be processed in time for you to take the test.

Does your uploaded photo meet the LSAC photo requirements? (See page 1 of the LSAT Candidate Information Sheet.) **The uploaded photo must be a different photograph than the one on your government-issued ID or you will not be admitted to the test.**

1 week before the test

Obtain a clear, plastic ziplock bag (maximum size 1 gallon/3.79 liters) to contain permissible items. (See page 2 of the LSAT Candidate Information Sheet for permitted items in the testing room and on the desktop.)

Update your email and mailing address, if necessary, at LSAC.org.

The day before your scheduled test

Print an updated LSAT Admission Ticket (that includes your uploaded photo) from your online account to ensure that you have the final and correct reporting address for the test center.

Check the school's website and print directions and a campus map.

Review the list of items allowed in the ziplock bag (page 2 of the LSAT Candidate Information Sheet).

Test day

Report to the test center no later than the reporting time indicated on your LSAT Admission Ticket.

Take only page 1 of the Admission Ticket (that includes the photo) to the test center. Your photo-bearing LSAT Admission Ticket is required for you to be admitted to the test. Leave this checklist and the Candidate Information Sheet at home.

Do not take any prohibited items or electronic devices (**including cell phones**) to the test center. **Possession of such items is grounds for immediate dismissal from the test.**
